



“I am the resurrection and the life”



“The Raising Of Lazarus” - a Rembrandt van Rijn etching from the year 1632 made an overwhelming impression on me from the moment I first saw it in the book that I found in the basement of my parents’ house. In the artist’s depiction of this famous scene, Lazarus is barely visible as his mind and soul seem only with difficulty to follow his body as it moves towards life. The dominating figure in the etching is Jesus standing over the grave with an extended hand. It is an expression of the power of Jesus as the Lord of life in his act of love and mercy. The people around him are not looking at Jesus but at Lazarus. This is not a surprise: if the blind man healed by Jesus from the story we read last Sunday professed: “It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind.” (J 9:31), what about an unheard-of miracle of raising someone from the dead?

Actually, this miracle was not a miracle but a sign - if we follow the theology of St. John. For John, Jesus’ miracles – and his works in general – are “signs”. These actions give us the intimations of the true identity of the one who does them, and as a consequence, they aim to enkindle faith. For this reason, this

story as well as the one from last Sunday (the healing of the blind man) and also others, has been presented from ancient Christian times to catechumens – those who wanted to discover who Jesus is in preparation for their baptism. The rising of Lazarus is the last “sign”, out of seven in John’s Gospel, that Jesus works in order to manifest the glory of the Father and announce his personal glorification at his Passover, his passion and resurrection. The resurrection is - as some indicate - the ultimate, the greatest and the final “sign”.

What is the difference between a miracle and a sign? A sign is a miracle with meaning, pointing at something, and as was mentioned above, intended for enkindling faith. The sign has to be recognized and accepted. As we heard in today’s story of Lazarus, “many of the Jews who had come to Mary [Lazarus’s sister] and seen what he had done began to believe in him.” However, in the next passage we also read about something unbelievable: “some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done” and plotted against Jesus and Lazarus, even though they just witnessed a miracle. They did not recognize this amazing miracle as a sign.

This is a strong warning for us that even the greatest sign from God could be disregarded, wasted or even openly rejected.

The “sign” of the raising of Lazarus prepares us to understand well the meaning of the Lord’s passion. Jesus is the source of life, not only of this earthly one but of eternal life as well. The story leads us to the dialogue with Martha, the other sister of Lazarus, and to the culminating point of the revelation, which confers meaning of the sign: “I am the resurrection and the life”. This declaration of Jesus is followed by the ever-sounding question, “Do you believe this?”





- † Service Project sheets for eight (8) hours of service



THE NEW LIFE TO COME

Death does not have the final say. This is the great mystery we ponder on this Fifth Sunday of Lent. Martha and Mary were good friends of Jesus. They did not hide their confusion and grief from the Lord; they voiced their conviction that if Jesus had been with them during their brother's illness, he would not have died. Jesus entered into their grief and more—he overturned it. Lazarus' death became the occasion for Jesus to show all who had gathered the mercy of God who cries out, “Oh my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them.” In this moment, the world was given a sign of the new life to come through Christ, the Risen One.

FROM DEATH TO NEW LIFE

There really is no way around it. Eventually, we will grapple with the death of a loved one, a parent, sibling, spouse, or dear friend. As we mature, we also begin to come to terms with our own mortality. Our Sunday readings this Lent have invited our reflection on the big questions of life and faith. We have resolved to turn away from sin and toward God, listening to the Lord and responding with open minds and hearts. We have acknowledged and perhaps heightened our thirst for the Lord and have committed ourselves to walk in the light of God's grace. Today, we journey from death to new life, reflecting on the mystery of Christ who is the resurrection and the life.

COME TO BELIEVE

Martha had a uniquely personal relationship with Jesus. She spoke with him honestly, baring her heart to Jesus, openly expressing her confusion and sorrow at her brother's death. Jesus' response led Martha to a deep declaration of faith, “I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world.” We, too, can have a uniquely personal relationship with Jesus. We can speak honestly to the Lord, baring our hearts, expressing the truth of each moment of our lives, whether in joy or sorrow, happiness, grief, confusion, or times of fulfillment. In such honesty and trust, we may find deeper faith as well, coming to believe that Christ is our all, our way, truth, and life.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
