#### He is Present Among Us

Jesus said, "I am with you always even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Then where are you, Lord? We cannot see or hear you. Where are you hiding? How can we believe that your promise is real and not just a beautiful metaphor?

Jesus is really present among us, but He is present under a veil. First, He is present in His Church. St. Paul gives us a clear explanation of this presence when he states that we are the Body and Jesus is the head of this Body, the Church. We can see a powerful confirmation of this truth in the story of the conversion of St. Paul. It is recorded in the Acts of the Apostles that Saul, who later became Paul, on the way to Damascus heard Jesus say, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" Since Paul persecuted the Church, it seems logical that Jesus, standing in defense of His Church, would rather ask him, "Why do you persecute my Church?" and not say "why do you persecute me." It clearly indicates that Jesus is present on this earth in His Church.

Jesus is present also, or above all, in His Church in a different way: in the Eucharist. Under the species of bread and wine, Jesus himself is among us, not symbolically but really. Moreover, Jesus said that His Body is food for eternal life. It unites a person with Jesus, anticipates his or her union with God in the future life, and strengthens us in resisting anything evil to develop goodness and love here on earth.

Two weeks ago, we celebrated the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In the parishes of our deanery, we continued this feast for an entire week. Last Sunday, we celebrated the conclusion of the Octave of Corpus Christi here in our parish. Although I thought that attendance would be larger than normal, I never

anticipated so many people present at the 10 am Mass and at the Eucharistic procession and picnic that followed. Every single spot was occupied in our huge parking lot. The church was full and the procession to the four altars or stations was magnificent. The entire Church was present: Bishop Ronald Hicks, visiting priests and deacons, religious sisters, members of various groups and organizations, the faithful from our parish and other parishes of our deanery.

The procession was a public manifestation of

our faith, the Body of the Church giving praise to Her Head, but it was we who obviously benefited the most. So many people were uplifted by this celebration, and it renewed or increased in them their respect and



gratitude to Jesus who is present in the Eucharist. This is a clear sign that God really acts in His Church for her spiritual goodness. It is visible that the special accent put on the Eucharist during the National Eucharistic Revival is producing bountiful fruits.

Once again, thank you to all the people and groups who contributed to the solemn celebration of the Mass, procession, and joyful picnic.







- Delve into the details of each of the <u>four Routes</u> highlighted below, especially the <u>MARIAN ROUTE</u>, which is passing by us here in the Diocese of Joliet!





During this Eucharistic Revival, we are called to walk with Jesus. On a national level, groups of young adults will be walking thousands of miles, and portions of these miles will involve **processions with our Eucharistic Lord Jesus**, towards the Eucharistic Congress to be held in July this year 2024 in Indianapolis. A small, dedicated group of young adults – "**Perpetual Pilgrims**" – will make the full journey to Indianapolis, traveling full-time from May 2024 until July walking a total of 6,500+ miles over these four routes. They will be led by clergy and followed by a support van. Our Perpetual Pilgrims will rely on the biblical hospitality of local hosts, including lay families, parishes, religious orders, schools, and shrines along the way.

Those who meet up with the Pilgrimage and walk with them for any portion of the <u>four routes</u> (see above) — the <u>Marian</u> route, the <u>Seton</u> route, the <u>Juan Diego</u> route, or the <u>Serra</u> route — are part of our Eucharistic Caravan. Then, on July 16, 2024, all four branches of this historic Pilgrimage will converge in Indianapolis for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress—a milestone within the Revival and a historic moment for the Church in the U.S. The reinstitution of this legacy will gather our Catholic family in Indianapolis for a transformative experience that will bear fruit for generations to come. If you are able, JOIN US AS WE RECONSECRATE THE HEART OF OUR NATION! Jesus walks with us, carrying and caring for us as we journey together towards eternal life with and in Him. He is our Paschal Lamb, and we have a strong Protector in Him! ### **Stop Assisted Suicide**

#### A Better Way Forward - A Message from the Catholic Bishops of Illinois

Legislation has been introduced to legalize assisted suicide in Illinois. SB 3499 makes it legal for a physician to prescribe an array of lethal drugs to a person diagnosed with a terminal disease who requests to end his or her life. The Catholic Bishops of Illinois oppose this legislation; there is a better way forward for our state.

Assisted suicide disregards the Hippocratic Oath, "Do No Harm," and sends the wrong message about the role of medical professionals. We cannot say it any better than the American Medical Association: "Physician assisted suicide is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would provide serious societal risks."

This legislation brings a range of possible abuses. It should alarm us that in states with legalized assisted suicide there are documented cases of people being offered inexpensive lethal drugs to end their life rather than being provided more costly treatment. The poor and those with disabilities are particularly in jeopardy because they are the most vulnerable to abuses. Every major national organization that represents people with disabilities is opposed to assisted suicide.

In Oregon, where assisted suicide has been legal since 1997, data show that pain is not among the top five reasons why a person wants to end their life. Loss of autonomy, feelings of being a burden and being less able to engage in activities that make life enjoyable are most often cited as reasons for choosing assisted suicide. A better way forward is to expand mental health coverage and strengthen social supports such as community programs to help those dealing with depression and feelings of hopelessness.

No one wants to suffer or experience a loved one's suffering. Fortunately, there are effective ways to alleviate suffering or make a person more comfortable at the end of life through palliative care. This relatively new specialty area of medicine cares for the whole person — physically, emotionally, socially, and spiritually — to relieve symptoms and stress that often accompany serious illness or side effects of treatment. A better way forward is to expand the number of palliative care locations and services in all areas of Illinois.


