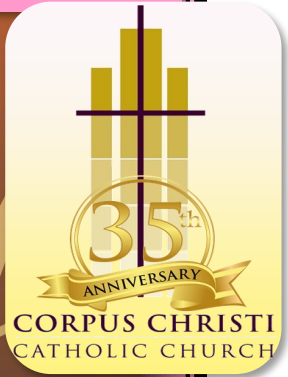

## The Pastor's Corner...

### Open Wide the Doors of Hope

Pope Francis will inaugurate a Jubilee Year focused on the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope," when he opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome on the Vigil of Christmas. The Jubilee Year is a special year of grace in which the Church offers the faithful the possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence. This is a means for the faithful to gain the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins by the merits of Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints. This Holy Door will be open until January 6, 2026.

On days following the St. Peter's Holy Door opening, the Holy Doors of three other papal basilicas in Rome – St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major – will open and remain so until the end of the Jubilee Year. A person on pilgrimage to one of Rome's basilicas or to a cathedral church or any other designated church who fulfills certain spiritual conditions for indulgence can gain special grace during the Jubilee Year.

This special year provides an opportunity to be renewed in hope, not only for millions of pilgrims who are expected to travel to Rome for this Jubilee, but also for those who are unable to do so. They can celebrate it in their local churches or through pilgrimages to Marian shrines across the world. The Jubilee is also an opportunity for conversion and reconciliation with God through the sacrament of penance, obtaining indulgences through God's mercy, renewing our faith and love through hope, and proclaiming God's love to the many people suffering in today's world.

For the Jubilee Year, a special logo was created that we placed in the narthex at the entrance to our church. It contains several elements that refer to Christian symbols.

At the center of the logo, there is a cross that ends with an anchor. Next to the cross, there are four figures. The entire scene is on water. The inscription at the bottom of the logo reads: "Pilgrims of Hope". All these elements are not accidental or simply for decorative purposes. They deliver a profound theological message. Let's look more closely at the elements of the Jubilee Year logo.

The logo shows that we all are pilgrims sailing to the eternal kingdom, to live there forever. The cross in the logo refers to Jesus Christ and our faith and is in fact the **mast** of the ship. The four people in the logo are stylized as sails. It is the sail that moves a ship forward. We know that a

sail can work **only** when it is attached to the mast because a sail without a mast is useless. As Christians, we understand this connection clearly and try to cling to Christ in our journey, remembering the Lord's words: "without me you can do nothing" (Jn 15:5).

The people on the ship not only hold onto the cross but are also holding on to one another.

This highlights the very nature of the Church: we are sailing together -- not in isolation, nor alone. We support each other on our journey: we pray for each other, we help each other materially and spiritually, and we "bear one another's

burdens" (Gal 6:2). The presence of exactly four people in the logo also has a meaning. The four people symbolize the four corners of the world - meaning the entire world. This shows that Jesus' salvation and his leading of people is not limited to a chosen group, but it is **universal**. It applies to all people, "from every nation, tribe, people and language" (Rev 7:9).

Finally, there is also the **anchor** at the bottom of the cross. From the very beginning of Christianity, the anchor was a symbol of **hope**. Like an iron anchor that secures a ship during a storm, Jesus Christ and faith provides safety for Christians, even during turmoil, persecution or hardship. We use this material world only temporally in our continuous **pilgrimage** to the house of our Father in heaven. There it is our unperishable harbor and true home.

May all these symbols open us to a real existence of God in our life and to His leading us through our life. Journeying with Jesus and his Church, we are assured that we will not go astray, not be lost, or wrecked. He assures us "not a hair on your head will be destroyed" (Lk 21:18). With Jesus and his Church, we pilgrimize in the right direction to a safe harbor, the only one, sailing full of joy and hope.

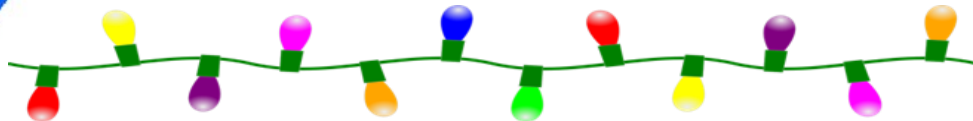

## Blessing of the Christmas Bambino (Baby Jesus)

### Bring the blessings of Christmas into your home.

The Nativity Scene, a beloved part of Christmas decorations the world over, can be traced to the love for and devotion to Christ by St. Francis of Assisi. For Catholics, both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope St. John Paul II said that the Nativity Scene in our homes is THE central decoration of the Christmas Season. The Nativity Scene captures the one single moment in history when all creation stood still out of wonder because God was born as a baby!

**NEXT weekend at all Masses, we are holding a Blessing of the Christmas Bambinos (Baby Jesus). Bring the “Baby Jesus” figurine from your home Nativity Scene to Mass and Father will bless these figurines during the Mass. That way, you’ll have the blessings of Christmas, from the hands of Father, in your home throughout the Christmas Season. This beautiful custom is a great way to keep Christ at the center of this holy season.**

### Blessing of a Christmas Nativity Scene for use at home

In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas Crèche or Manger for Christmas Eve of 1223. The Blessing of the Christmas Nativity Scene in your home may take place on Christmas Eve, or when you set up the scene, or perhaps before a special family gathering or meal during this beautiful season.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

*Our help is in the name of the Lord.*

Response: *Who made heaven and earth.*

Someone reads the Scripture, for example, Luke 2:14.

(At the end of the Gospel) Reader: *The Gospel of the Lord.*

Response: *Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.*

All pray (with hands joined if so desired), and either one person or all pray together the prayer of blessing. Following the prayer, the Nativity Scene can be sprinkled with holy water (if some is available in your home. Holy water can be obtained at church).

Blessing Prayer:

*Let us pray. God of every nation and people,  
from the very beginning of creation  
you have made manifest your love:  
when our need for a Savior was great  
you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.  
To our lives he brings joy and peace,  
justice, mercy, and love.*

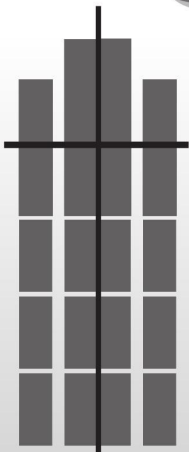
*Lord, bless all who look upon this manger;

# Blessing of a Christmas Tree

The use of the Christmas tree is relatively modern. Its origins are found in the medieval mystery plays that depicted the tree of paradise and the Christmas light or candle that symbolized Christ, the Light of the world.

According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity of Epiphany. The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

In the home the Christmas tree may be blessed by a parent or another family member, in connection with the evening meal on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time on Christmas Day.

*When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."*

*The leader may greet those present in the following words:*

Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever.

*R/ Amen.*

*In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:*

My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.

*One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:*

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the Letter of Saint Paul to Titus:

But when the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life.

*Or: Ezekiel 17:22-24 - I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel.*

*Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.*

*The intercessions are then said. The leader says:*

Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord. *R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.*

That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on which Christ accomplished our salvation, let us pray to the Lord. *R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.*

That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes, let us pray to the Lord.

*R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.*

That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the world, let us pray to the Lord.

*R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.*

*After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer....Our Father...*

*The leader says the prayer with hands joined:*

*Lord our God, we praise you for the light of creation: the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night. We praise you for the light of Israel: the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures. We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son: he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace, who fills us with the wonder of your love.*

*Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree. May the light and cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts. May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord.*

*R/. Amen.*

*The lights of the tree are then illuminated. The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:*

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace and joy, now and forever. *R/ Amen.*

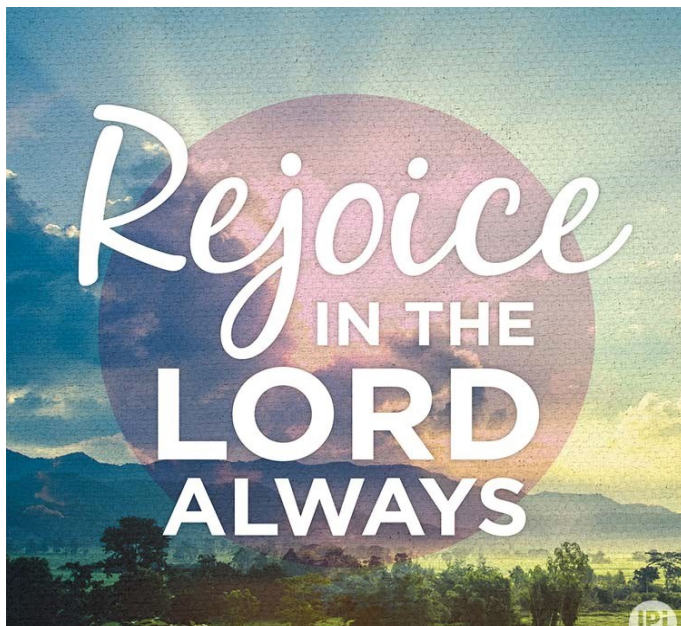

## The "O Antiphons" of Advent

For several years in Advent we have beautiful banners hanging from the ceiling of our church. They depict **seven antiphons** that the Roman Church has been singing since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the *Magnificat* canticle of Evening Prayer from **December 17-23** and are also used as the Alleluia verses on the same days during the Mass. Their magnificent theology uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Each antiphon is a name of Christ, one of his attributes mentioned in Scripture. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. May this longing be also our longing as we go deeper and deeper into Advent.

### December 17 "O Sapientia"

**O Wisdom** of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!



### December 18 "O Adonai"

**O Leader** of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!



### December 19 "O Radix Jesse"

**O Root of Jesse's** stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!



### December 20 "O Clavis David"

**O Key of David,** opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!



### December 21 "O Oriens"

**O Radiant Dawn,** splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

### December 22 "O Rex Gentium"

**O King of all nations** and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!



**December 23 "O Emmanuel"**  
**O Emmanuel,** our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!
