The Pastor's Corner...

Leap For Joy – God is With Us

This Sunday - the Fourth Sunday of Advent - we are just a few days before Christmas. In the final preparation for Christmas, the Gospel tells us how Mary, bearing her child within her, traveled to her relative, Elizabeth. Mary is not the one who tells Elizabeth that she is pregnant. Instead, the Holy Spirit causes the child in Elizabeth's womb to "leap for joy." Elizabeth, like her child filled with the Holy Spirit, knows who Mary is and who is her child. She praises her with the greeting that millions of people have been repeating every day for centuries and millennia: "*Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.*"

The joy of Elizabeth and of the baby in her womb was authentic and profound because it referred to the most fundamental matter of any human life: life everlasting that was offered by the Savior, Messiah, Son of God. On December 25th, we, our families, and the entire Church will celebrate the historical appearance of the Savior who came to us as a child, born like us, born in poor conditions in Bethlehem. Let us join Elizabeth, her child John, the shepherds and others in this authentic and profound joy. Let us join the angels in their resplendent song: "*Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests.*" Let us join the Magi in their homage to the Newborn King as we gaze upon the baby Jesus in the Nativity scene and genuflect and kneel before Jesus in the Eucharist.



May this Good News also reach the people living in occupied Bethlehem and those suffering in Gaza, and in other countries around the Holy Land. May the Prince of Peace give them His true and just peace.

In Jesus Christ, the Son of God - God Himself, God from God - became man. God has become one of us, so that we can be with Him and become like Him. As a sign, He chose the Child lying in the manger: this is how God is. This is how we come to know Him.

As we enter the amazing and beautiful Christmas, may God bless us and our families as we celebrate the inauguration of the salvation of the entire world and each of us.

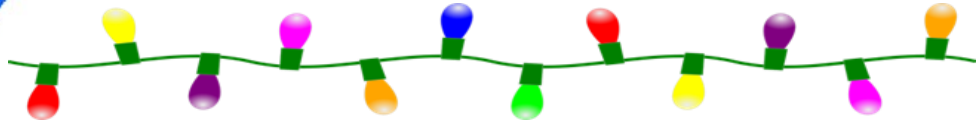

Blessing of the Christmas Bambino (Baby Jesus)

Bring the blessings of Christmas into your home.

The Nativity Scene, a beloved part of Christmas decorations the world over, can be traced to the love for and devotion to Christ by St. Francis of Assisi. For Catholics, both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope St. John Paul II said that the Nativity Scene in our homes is THE central decoration of the Christmas Season. The Nativity Scene captures the one single moment in history when all creation stood still out of wonder because God was born as a baby!

THIS weekend at all Masses, we are holding a Blessing of the Christmas Bambinos (Baby Jesus). Bring the “Baby Jesus” figurine from your home Nativity Scene to Mass and Father will bless these figurines during the Mass. That way, you’ll have the blessings of Christmas, from the hands of Father, in your home throughout the Christmas Season. This beautiful custom is a great way to keep Christ at the center of this holy season.

Blessing of a Christmas Nativity Scene for use at home

In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas Crèche or Manger for Christmas Eve of 1223. The Blessing of the Christmas Nativity Scene in your home may take place on Christmas Eve, or when you set up the scene, or perhaps before a special family gathering or meal during this beautiful season.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Response: *Who made heaven and earth.*

Someone reads the Scripture, for example, Luke 2:14.

(At the end of the Gospel) Reader: *The Gospel of the Lord.*

Response: *Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.*

All pray (with hands joined if so desired), and either one person or all pray together the prayer of blessing. Following the prayer, the Nativity Scene can be sprinkled with holy water (if some is available in your home. Holy water can be obtained at church).

Blessing Prayer:

*Let us pray. God of every nation and people,
from the very beginning of creation
you have made manifest your love:
when our need for a Savior was great
you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.
To our lives he brings joy and peace,
justice, mercy, and love.*

*Lord, bless all who look upon this manger;
may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus,
and raise our thoughts to him,
who is God-with-us and Savior of all,
and who lives and reigns forever and ever.*

Response: *Amen.*



Blessing of a Christmas Tree

The use of the Christmas tree is relatively modern. Its origins are found in the medieval mystery plays that depicted the tree of paradise and the Christmas light or candle that symbolized Christ, the Light of the world.

According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity of Epiphany. The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

In the home the Christmas tree may be blessed by a parent or another family member, in connection with the evening meal on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time on Christmas Day.

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."

The leader may greet those present in the following words:

Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever.

R/ Amen.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the Letter of Saint Paul to Titus:

But when the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life.

Or: Ezekiel 17:22-24 - I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.

The intercessions are then said. The leader says:

Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord. *R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.*

That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on which Christ accomplished our salvation, let us pray to the Lord. *R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.*

That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the world, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer....Our Father...

The leader says the prayer with hands joined:

Lord our God, we praise you for the light of creation: the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night. We praise you for the light of Israel: the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures. We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son: he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace, who fills us with the wonder of your love.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree. May the light and cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts. May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The lights of the tree are then illuminated. The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace and joy, now and forever. *R/ Amen.*

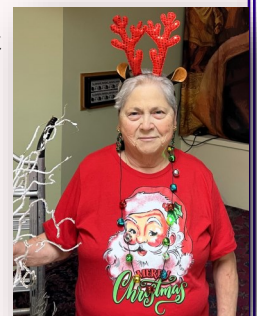

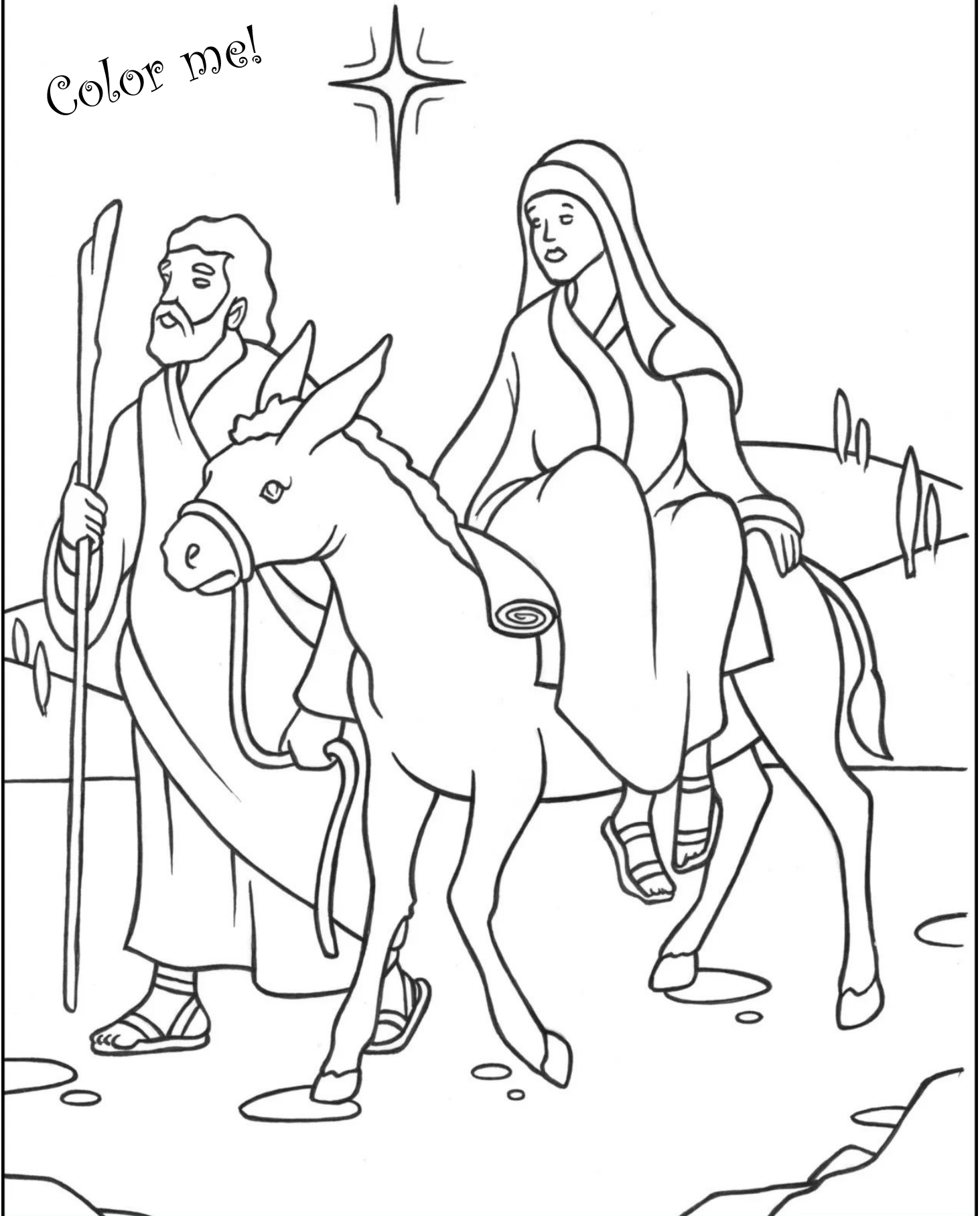
Breakfast With Santa
